


**2011 In Review**

- 38 IA Declarations in US and territories
  - 10 in Region IV (26%)
- 573,852 IA Registrations
  - 165,338 in Region IV (29%)
- 12 States with 2 (or more) Declarations
  - 4 in Region IV (33%)

## Whole Communities

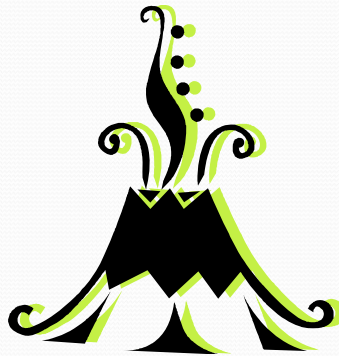
Are:

## Plan for the Real

- Plan for what communities will need should a severe event occur and not just for the existing resources on hand.



## Pathways for Action

- How can we better understand the actual needs of the communities we serve?
- What partnerships might we need in order to develop an understanding of the community's needs?
- How do we effectively engage the whole community in emergency management to include a wide breadth of community members?
- How do we generate interest in disaster preparedness to get a seat at the table with community organizations?.

## National Disaster Recovery Framework (NDRF)

- Identifying and assessing risks;
- Estimating capability requirements;
- Building or sustaining capabilities;
- Developing and implementing plans to deliver those capabilities;
- Validating and monitoring progress made towards achieving the National Preparedness Goal; and
- Reviewing and updating efforts to promote continuous improvement.

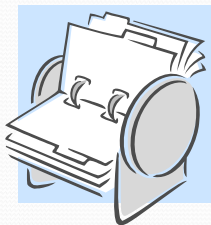
